- Speed of 102 mph





The Victim: Teacher Tammy Thompson (deceased)




- Driving home from high school football game
- Beloved math teacher
- Married with minor child
- Tremendous outpouring of community support at memorial services





The Project: Diverging Diamond Interchange



- Cited by Popular Science as one of the best engineering innovations of 2009
- At time of incident, DDIs introduced in in four other states
- But first of its kind in Anytown, USA
- Designed by ABC Engineers





The Wrongful Death Lawsuit



Plaintiffs:

- Estate of Teacher Tammy
- Husband
- Minor child
- Mother
- Father

Defendants:

- ABC Engineers
- State DOT
- City #1
- City #2
- General Contractor
- Traffic Signage Sub
- Lighting Sub #1
- Lighting Sub #2
- Pavement Markings Sub





What did plaintiffs allege?



- Defective (confusing) design
- DDI opened prematurely, prior to completing basic safety features
- Inadequate signage, pavement markings, and lighting as required by contracts and industry standards
- Conditions existed for several months before accident



Plaintiffs' Initial Demand



\$85,000,000

ABC Engineering confident this is a case of "no liability" or "cost of defense"





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#1 reason to litigate?

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Discovery Phase



- Unclear scope of services
- Problematic communications
- Glacial pace of discovery
- Municipalities file early MSJ



The case rolls on...



Plaintiffs' Expert Report:

- Temporary paint used for pavement markings and had faded
- Full specified lighting not installed prior to DDI opening or accident
- Study shows 60% of wrong way accidents involve drunk drivers & primary origin of wrong way movement are entry/exit ramps



Plaintiffs' New Demand



\$20,000,000 (globally)





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#1 reason to settle?

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Barreling toward trial...



- Threatened indemnity cross-claims
- Project engineer leaves ABC
- Skyrocketing costs/deductible exhausted
- Litigation fatigue
- Lawsuit has faded from public eye
- Fear of being "last man standing"

Initial evaluation based on limited information should not necessarily drive decision to settle or litigate
